PLAYERS' CODE OF BEHAVIOUR

 \cdot Play for the "fun of if' and not just to please parents and coaches.

 \cdot Play by the rules.

 \cdot Never argue with an official. If you disagree, have your, captain or coach approach the official during a break or after the game.

 \cdot Control your temper. Verbal abuse of officials or other players, deliberately fouling or provoking an opponent and throwing equipment is not acceptable or permitted in any sport.

 \cdot Work equally hard for yourself and your team. Your team's performance will benefit and so will you.

 \cdot Treat all players as you would like to be treated. Do not interfere with, bully, or take unfair advantage of another player.

 \cdot Co-operate with your coach, team-mates and opponents. Without them there would be no game.

SPECTATORS' CODE OF BEHAVIOUR

 \cdot Students play organised sport for fun. They are not playing for the entertainment of spectators only, nor are they miniature professionals.

 \cdot Applaud good performance and efforts by your team AND the opponents. Congratulate both teams upon their performance regardless of the game's outcome.

 \cdot Respect the official's decision. If there is a disagreement, follow the appropriate procedure in order to question the decision and teach the children to do likewise.

 \cdot Never ridicule a player for making a mistake during a competition. Positive comments are motivating.

 \cdot Condemn the use of violence in any form, be it by spectators, coaches, officials or players.

 \cdot Show respect for your team's opponents. Without them there would be no game.

· Encourage players to play according to the rules and the officials' decisions.

 \cdot Demonstrate appropriate social behaviour by not using foul language, harassing players, coaches or officials
